

**Q**: What is special about your MBA program? In addition to its' excellent reputation, what differentiates it from other Top MBA programs?

**A**: There are many elements that make a Tuck MBA distinct. Tuck's vibrant, welcoming community and giving culture promotes trust and forges strong bonds and lifelong connections. This extends to its 10,000-strong and famously loyal global network of alumni who generously provide teaching, counsel, and networking opportunities across the community.

Q: Are there any recent changes in the programs or in the admission process?

**A**: We are still outlining next year's admissions process, and applicants can anticipate that the 2022-2023 process will be similar to the 2021-2022 process.

**Q:** Has the COVID-19 situation have an impact on getting accepted to the programs at your school? Is there any other impact candidates should be aware of?

**A**: Tuck has an active, collaborative learning community distinguished by the core values of being personal, connected, and transformative, and we continue to recruit wise, decisive leaders who better the world of business. Interviews were conducted virtually during the past two years because of COVID, and that will likely continue for most if not all interviews into the new application year.

**Q**: Can you share some details about the atmosphere in the school? Amongst the students? Between students and faculty? How do students spend their free time?

A: If you've talked to anyone about Tuck, you've heard about the close-knit community or Tuck Fabric. The essence of what distinguishes Tuck is our collaborative, trust-based community. Tuck is an engaged and vibrant community, with strong ties within classes and across class years. Tuck faculty are world-renowned scholars and researchers, and dedicated teachers, bringing their knowledge into the classroom. Personal interaction with faculty is a distinction of learning at Tuck. A spectrum of activities at Dartmouth and in the Upper Valley provides opportunities for entertainment, socializing, recreation, learning, and growth. At Tuck, students can choose to join (or start their own!) club or organization. Student pathways to Tuck are diverse and students are encouraged to contribute their unique talents.

Q: Can you share some details about the area the school is located in?

A: Located about 2 hours north of Boston, Tuck's hometown of Hanover, NH, is a quintessential New England town. Tuck's location is free from the distractions of a big city and allows you to immerse yourself and focus on learning and developing relationships with your classmates and the faculty. Because we are a small town, students either live on campus or nearby. They don't scatter when class is over. They remain together, creating an immersive living and learning environment.

**Q**: Can you share some details regarding job opportunities and summer internships for students in your school?

**A**: More than 1,000 companies and organizations recruit Tuck students—propelling our graduates to employment levels and compensation rates at or near the highest of those of the top MBA programs worldwide.



**Q**: What is it that you are looking for in a candidate? Who will especially enjoy this school? who will be a good fit to the school?

**A**: Tuck classes are diverse by design, but our students share four common characteristics that form the basis of our admissions criteria. Tuck students are smart, accomplished, aware and encouraging; no two candidates are equally strong across all criteria, and you may demonstrate different strengths in different ways.

Q: One most important piece of advice for an applicant based on your experience?A: Do your research: know yourself and know the schools to which you are applying.

- **Q**: What NOT to do in the admissions process?
- A: Don't treat each school like they are the same. While you may get a great education at any of the top business schools, the experience you have at each will be very different.
- Q: Are later rounds worth considering?

**A:** Tuck admits qualified applicants in every round, and applicants should apply as early as they feel they can submit a strong application.

**Q:** GMAT and importance as a % of the candidacy? What is the minimum GMAT you are looking for? **A:** Tuck does not have a minimum GMAT or GRE score requirement—admitted students have a <u>range</u> of <u>scores</u>. But if you feel that your GMAT or GRE score is not reflective of your academic aptitude, we encourage you to take the exam again in an effort to improve your score.

Q: Is there anything you'd like our candidates to know regarding the admissions process?
