CURRICULUM

In the integrated core curriculum, you'll study real issues and real companies from the perspectives of multiple stakeholders and develop the multidisciplinary understanding to lead your organization to success.

The **State and Society** course teaches you the big-picture context for your work. You'll learn how companies interact with and impact the societies that surround them, giving you a grasp of legal and regulatory environments and policy issues like gender and racial discrimination, immigration, education, and public health.
